

3. Bell is working on a book about her relationship with Bonds with the author, Aphrodite Jones. Jones convinced Bell to go on Geraldo Rivera's show this weekend and talk about some of the details of her relationship with Bonds. Jones told Bell that because of Jose Canseco's book and 60 Minutes appearance, they needed to act now or risk having things pass them by. Bell told Jones that she wasn't sure about this plan since they didn't yet have a book deal in place. Jones told Bell that she was going on Geraldo Rivera whether or not Bell came with her. Bell felt that it was best that she go on Geraldo too so that she could speak for herself.

4. Lance Williams of the San Francisco Chronicle has been working with Bell for the last seven months. Bell has shared everything she knows about Bonds with Williams. Bell wrote several letters to the Chronicle detailing her relationship with Bonds. Williams has been sitting on the story for several months at Bell's request. Bell wanted to have the book deal in place before the Chronicle ran her story. Williams was very upset with Bell going on Geraldo Rivera this weekend. Bell does not know if the San Francisco Chronicle is going to run her story any time soon. Williams told Bell that the story still needed to go through "the approval process". Bell has showed Williams documents regarding her relationship with Bonds including notes from Bonds, travel documents and gift receipts. Bell has also played Williams numerous voicemail messages left by Bonds. Bell has about two hours of voicemail messages from Bonds that she has kept over the years. Bell stated that she is not the source that the Chronicle played the Greg Anderson recordings to. She does not know who made the recording of Anderson or who the Chronicle had listen to it.

5. Bonds choked Bell one time in San Francisco. When Bell returned back to Scottsdale, Arizona, she called the Scottsdale police department to report this. She told them that a very famous person had assaulted her. She stated that the person on the line began yelling at her to disclose who it was that choked her and that they would cross state lines to arrest this person. Bell stated that she got scared and hung up the phone without reporting Bonds' name. Bonds has threatened Bell several times, even threatening to kill her. He once told her that he would chop off her head and put it in a ditch. Bell stated that this was after the OJ Simpson affair and that she was genuinely scared of Bonds.

6. The year that Mark McGuire and Sammy Sosa had the home run battle, Bonds confided in Bell that everyone in baseball was doing steroids. In 1999 or 2000, Bonds told Bell that he was taking steroids to help with an elbow injury. Bell noticed significant physical changes in Bonds after he confided in her that he was taking steroids. Bonds told her that he was doing steroids, but not doing it to the level that bodybuilders were. He referred to the bodybuilders as "druggies". Bonds had an injury on his elbow and Bonds told Bell that the steroids were allowing him to heal quicker. During this time, Bonds became "huge" and "bloated". He had severe acne on his back. He began to lose his hair and shaved his head. He began shaving his chest where more hair was growing. He began suffering sexual dysfunction. He began using Viagra. His testicles shrank. He would sometimes go "limp" in the middle of sex and blame it on leg cramps. Bonds also began to show signs of severe irritation. He would become irritated at the smallest things.

7. Bonds broke up with Bell in May of 2003. Bonds called Bell and told her that she needed to disappear. Bell does not know why Bonds didn't just break up with her instead of telling her to disappear. Bell guesses that Bonds dealt with her that way because of what she knows about his steroid use. Just before the breakup, Bonds had been acting strangely around

her. They would check into different hotels from where the team was staying on the road. The week of the breakup, the Giants were playing the Diamondbacks and the team was staying in the Ritz Carlton in Arizona. Bonds and Bell checked into a different hotel than the rest of the team. This did not usually happen.

8. Bonds paid for the down payment on Bell's home in Arizona, which was purchased in January of 2002. Over the course of several months before Bell purchased the home in Scottsdale, Bonds gave Bell approximately \$80,000 in currency. Bonds instructed Bell to place it into her bank account in less than \$9,000 increments and to use multiple bank accounts to get the money deposited quicker. Bonds told Bell that you could only put so much cash at a time into the bank. It was Bell's understanding that Bonds got the currency from memorabilia signings. Bonds was receiving currency from these signings "under the table." Bell thinks that Bonds paid for the construction of his vacation home in the Bahamas with currency that he received "under the table". Bonds did not want the money used to purchase the house traced to him so he had Bell methodically place it into her bank account. Bell has bank records showing where all of the currency was deposited. Bonds told Bell that the \$80,000 in cash that he gave her was money that his accountants could not trace. Bonds told Bell that he could come by money easily by "signing some stuff".

9. After their breakup, and after the publicized search warrants on Balco and Greg Anderson's residence, Bell began receiving calls and letters from Dan Moliari, a former San Francisco cop and private investigator who works with Bonds, and Mike Rains, Barry Bonds' attorney. Bell showed me a letter she received from Mike Rains which was dated September 19, 2003. The letter requested a meeting with Bell. Bell's attorney contacted Rains and told him that Bell wanted the house that Bonds purchased for her in Arizona paid off. Bonds countered with a settlement offer of \$20,000 and a signed confidentiality agreement by Bell. Bell agreed to sign the agreement only if Bonds paid for the approximate \$157,000 remaining on her home in Arizona. Bonds declined through his attorney. This is what led Bell to begin her book project.

10. Bell knows Greg Anderson. Anderson began hanging around with Bonds in 1999 or 2000. It was unusual for Bonds to be hanging out with "a white guy with tattoos". Anderson called Bell shortly after Bonds broke up with her. Anderson encouraged Bell to call Bonds. Anderson lived with Bonds and Bell during several spring trainings in Arizona. While in Arizona, Anderson and Bonds often went into locked rooms together. Bell does not know what they were doing in the rooms. Anderson also traveled with Bonds to Japan. Bell does not know of Anderson visiting Bonds on the road during the season, although Bell was not allowed to travel to certain cities with Bonds. She believed that this was because Bonds had girlfriends in certain cities, including New York.

11. Bonds got everyone around him to sign non-disclosure/confidentiality agreements. This included Anderson and all of Bonds' housekeepers and his cooks. Bonds went through several housekeepers and cooks because he treated them so poorly. Bonds stole Gary Sheffield's cook after he had already gone through two of his own. Bonds is verbally abusive to everyone and treats everyone around him poorly.

12. Bonds purchased a Toyota Forerunner for Bell in 2000. Bell showed me the purchase contract for the vehicle. Bell's name is the listed buyer of the vehicle. The vehicle was

purchased from Toyota Sunnyvale. Bell does not know how the car was paid for. She just showed up at the dealership per Bonds' instructions and signed the papers for the car. Steve Hoskins, Bonds' friend, was at the dealership when Bell showed up to sign the paperwork. Hoskins probably knows how the car was paid for by Bonds.

13. Bonds gave Bell money throughout the years of the relationship. He always provided her with specific instructions on what she should do with the money. She used the money for various things such as rent and dental insurance.

14. Employees of the San Francisco Giants were aware of Bell's and Bonds' relationship. Reggie Younger, the Giants' traveling secretary, was aware of the relationship. Younger made travel reservations for Bell at the request of Bonds. Bell's travel was often paid for by the Giants. Bell showed me a travel itinerary on San Francisco Giants letterhead that had her name on it.

15. San Francisco Giants trainer Stan Conte was aware of Bell's and Bonds' relationship. When Bonds injured his back in Colorado, collapsing shortly after swinging at the ball and running to first base, Bell was with Bonds in his room after the game. Stan Conte and other Giants' training staff came to Bonds' room and saw Bell with Bonds. Bell also believes that the training staff would have noticed the physical transformations in Bonds after his steroid use began. She stated that the changes were obvious. Dusty Baker also knew about Bell's and Bonds' relationship. Baker loaned Bell a jacket once after seeing her in the stands looking cold.

16. In spring training of 2000, Bonds introduced Bell to Jason Giambi at a nightclub in Arizona. Giambi and Bonds were flexing their muscles and comparing who had larger muscles.

17. Bonds' rented a residence in Scottsdale during spring training for several years. The residence was owned by Rebecca Lynn Miller. Miller has also rented her house to Sammy Sosa in the past. The address of the residence is 9701 North 133rd Way, Scottsdale, AZ. The phone number is 480-451-0699. Miller called Bell once and stated that there was something she needed to speak with her regarding Bonds. Bonds had specifically instructed Bell to never speak with Miller because she was "crazy". Per Bonds' instructions, Bell told Miller that she didn't want to speak with her. Bonds was happy upon hearing this news. He told Bell that she might have to change her phone number if Miller called her back again. Bell never found out what Miller wanted to tell her about Bonds. Bell stated that Bonds told her that Miller signed a confidentiality/non-disclosure agreement with Bonds. Bell stated that Miller cleaned the house while Bonds was living there. The main residence had a guest residence in the rear. Miller stayed in the guest residence while Bonds was in the main residence. Bell stated that Miller may have wanted to tell her about other woman Bonds had at the house. Bell stated that it was typical that Bonds would have his wife in the house for a week, then Bell in the house for a week when the wife returned home.

18. Bell is aware that Bonds "fooled around" with other women. Bonds was involved with several strippers and porn actresses. Bell believes that Bonds had another girlfriend in New York. Bonds tried to "screw" Rachael Vizcarra, his publicist. Bell stated that Bonds paid Vizcarra a bonus of \$50,000 one year. Bell has called Bonds late at night and Vizcarra has been with him, leading her to believe that the two were sleeping together. Vizcarra has signed a confidentiality agreement with Bonds.

19. Bell knows Steve Hoskins well. Hoskins was Bonds' closest friend. Hoskins did everything for Bonds. Bell does not know the specific details behind Bonds' allegations that Hoskins was stealing from him. Bell does not believe that Hoskins entered into contracts on behalf of Bonds without Bonds' knowledge. Bell wonders how companies would enter into contracts without Bonds signatures and without issuing payments directly to Bonds. Bell believes that Bonds is falsely trying to blame things on Hoskins to protect himself. Hoskins knows about Bonds receiving money "under the table" for memorabilia signings. Hoskins also knows about \$400,000 in currency that was given to Bonds. Bell does not know the details surrounding the cash other than there was something suspicious about the way Bonds obtained it and it involved a Bentley automobile.

20. Bell stated that Steve Hoskins is someone that the government needs to speak with. He knows everything there is to know about Bonds. Hoskins would often act as the liaison between Bonds and Bell when Bonds was giving Bell money. Hoskins' family and Bonds' family are still close. Bonds' and Hoskins' dads were friends. Hoskins' dad played for the San Francisco 49ers while Bonds' dad was playing for the Giants.

21. When Bonds was on the road, he often checked into hotels under the name of Lamar Watson. Lamar is Bonds' middle name and Watson is his wife's maiden name.

22. Bell never sued Bonds for palimony. After she received the letter from Mike Rains in September of 2003, her attorney and Bonds' attorney corresponded and negotiated a confidentiality agreement and financial settlement between the two. No settlement was reached and Bell decided not to sue because an attorney told her that it would cost \$100,000. Bell has all of the correspondence between the attorney's and will provide me with copies. Bell's current attorney is Martin Garbus. Garbus is helping to facilitate the book deal. At the time of the correspondence back and forth between Bell and Bonds, Bell's attorney was Gina Devito. Bell was not happy with Devito's service.

23. In April 10, 2004, Bell received a phone call from Liz Bonds, Barry's wife. Liz Bonds told her that she knew everything that was going on and that she didn't care if Bell sued Barry or wrote a book, because when she (Liz Bonds) was done with Barry he'd have nothing left. She told Bell that she was getting their kids and the house in Los Angeles.


Bell agreed to make copies of documents that she has obtained over the years relative to Bonds and their relationship. These documents included correspondence, notes, financial receipts and travel records. Bell also provided me with a compact disc containing approximately two hours of voicemail messages from Bonds. I agreed to make a copy of the disk and return the original to her. Bell also has the original answering machine cassette tape which includes the original voicemail recordings from Bonds.

Bell wants to cooperate fully with the government investigation. She attempted to contact Senator McCain about her knowledge of Bonds but never received a response.

I told Bell that although I could not prevent her from doing so, it would be my request that she did not disclose her contact with federal investigators to anyone, including members of the

media. Bell stated that she had already earlier spoken to her attorney, Martin Garbus, about my visit, but would refrain from talking about it with anyone else.

I prepared this memorandum on February 15, 2005, from notes and recollections of the interview with Kimberly Bell on February 14, 2005.
